
UN not effective – coms v. non-coms

US adopts <u>containment</u> – foreign policy to keep communism from spreading First used by <u>George Kennan</u> (ambassador to USSR)

us vs. them mentality



"In these circumstances it is clear that the main element of any United States policy toward the Soviet Union must be that of long-term, patient but firm and vigilant containment of Russian expansive tendencies."

George Kennan, 1947

Major containment events:

Truman Doctrine
Marshall Plan
Berlin Airlift

1947 – Great Britain stopped sending aid to Turkey and Greece

<u>Domino Theory</u> – belief that if one country falls to communism it will spread to others

developed <u>Truman Doctrine</u> – plan to send money

Congress approved \$400 million

"Like apples in a barrel infected by one rotten one, the corruption of Greece would infect Iran and all to the east." — undersecretary of state, Dean Acheson

"I believe that it must be the policy of the US to support free peoples who are resisting attempted subjugation [conquering] by armed minorities or by outside pressures." — President Truman

George C. Marshall – secretary of state

1947 – wanted to help the "economies and spirits" of Western Europe

Marshall Plan - Congress approved, \$13 billion sent to Europe










Berlin Airlift

Germany divided between Allies Berlin located in Soviet zone





New currency introduced in West – hurt economy in East

Soviets block West Berlin – June 1948 Wanted other Allies to abandon city

US and RAF begin <u>Berlin Airlift</u> – flew supplies in to West Berlin

Western European nations, US, Canada



Warsaw Pact
