



The Life of Muhammad

570 – 632 Mecca, Saudi Arabia

Married to Khadija History of migraines

Night of Power - 610 – went to meditate in cave; vision of Angel Gabriel – made new prophet of Allah





Must correct errors, "Go and recite"

613 – recited to scribe, became **Quran Hadith** – prophetic traditions

Early converts Khadija and young people

Persecuted in Mecca; 622 - emigrated to Medina "city of the prophet" gained more followers

Mecca/Medina battles

630 - returned to Mecca

June 8, 632 Unexpected death of Muhammad

Possible aneurism

Controversies in Islam:

The successor of Muhammad - family or scribe?

After death of Khadija, married <u>Aisha</u> (9, 13)

Daughter <u>Fatima</u> married Muhammad's cousin, <u>Ali</u>

Ali claimed to be successor – bloodline

<u>Abu Bakr</u> – closest friend/scribe to Muhammad – most accept as successor

<u>Sunni</u> Muslims – "Tradition" – accept the line of elected successors

**Majority of Muslims


Shi'a Muslims – "faction" believe leaders must be descendents of Muhammad through Fatima and Ali


During the month of <u>Ramadan</u> - 9th month, believe Gates of heaven open/hell closed, celebrate Night of Power

Only if physically and financial able The Great Mosque and the Kaaba






Great Mosque – Mecca Up to 1 million people


Kaaba – "cube" - Most sacred site in Islam

























Islamic traditions:

Great Britain controlled Palestine – 1947 UN vote to partition land into territories for Jews/Arabs


Jerusalem – international

Does motive matter?

Terrorism

"An intentional act of hatred against a country, race, or religion with the goal of striking fear or killing the targeted group." – Grace Shugert and Marikate Polcyn

Terrorism

"The act of one or more person(s) or groups using fear induced by violence to promote ideas and intimidate opposition for their own personal gain, or to gain the upper hand in conflict (not including acts of war.)" – Ethan Phillips and Briana Turner

Has the US ever been terrorist?

"The September 11th attacks were a monstrous calling card from a world gone horribly wrong. The message may have been written by bin Laden (who knows?) and delivered by his couriers, but it well could have been signed by the ghosts of the victims of America's old wars....

The millions killed in Korea, Vietnam and Cambodia, the 17,500 killed when Israel – backed by the US – fighting Israel's occupation of the West Bank. And the millions who died, in Yugoslavia, Somalia, Haiti, Chile, Nicaragua, El Salvador, the Dominican Republic, Panama at the hands of all the terrorists, dictators and genocidists whom the American government supported, trained, bankrolled, and supplied with arms. And this is far from being a comprehensive list." – Arundhati Roy, The Guardian

1 of 50 children to Muhammad Awad bin Laden



Successful in school, invited to study group - taught violent Jihad

At 18 married cousin (14) went to University

Public administration/civil engineering??

December 24, 1979 – Soviet Union invades Afghanistan



1978 Communists (<u>People's Democratic</u> <u>Party of Afghanistan</u>) overthrew government

Extremely unpopular – formed alliance with USSR

Mujahideen – Groups of Islamic insurgents attacked new government

<u>"Afghan-Arabs"</u> – Sympathetic Muslims joined – bin Laden

- Unorganized, fragmented but successful
 - Operation Cyclone
 US funded via
 Pakistan anti-aircraft missiles, etc





USSR/PDPA control cities; Mujahideen – countryside Guerrilla tactics

USSR withdrew 1989

bin Laden returned to SA, US said he and his fighters "Freedom Fighters"

"USSR's Vietnam":

- 1. 1 million Afghans dead; 5 million refugees
- 2. 14,000 Soviets killed; 50,000 casualties
 - 3. \$\$\$ Billions
 - 4. Embarrassment

Afghanistan unstable; US aid slowed; **Taliban** take control

Bin Laden openly critical of SA and US Infidels in holy land

1992 - banished, lived in exile in Sudan

1993 - founded <u>al Qaeda</u> – "the base" – acts of violent Jihad – pure Islamic law
Goal = Bring US to war

1994 – SA revoke citizenship; family cuts ties (\$\$\$)

1996 – Exiled from Sudan, refuge with Taliban in Afghanistan

<u>September 11, 2001</u>

> 3,000 civilian deaths
