

Vietnam

1957-1975 \$150 billion 58,000 Americans dead Approx 2 mil Vietnamese dead

<u>Geneva Conference</u> – 1954 US, USSR, China, England, France

-Vietnam divided at the 17th parallel





<u>Ho Chi Minh</u> governs the north -Communist

Gulf of Tonkin incident:

August 2, 1964 <u>USS Maddox</u> attacked 28 mi off coast during routine patrol in the Gulf of Tonkin

August 4, 1964 - USS Turner Joy with Maddox

Turner Joy spots high speed vessels 4-15 mi away, both ships engage



August 7, 1964 Congress passed the <u>Gulf of</u> <u>Tonkin Resolution</u>

Allows the President to *"take all necessary measures to repel any armed attack against the forces of the US and to prevent further aggression"*

US + SV Vs. NV + **VietCong** (Vietnamese Communists)


US tactics:

1. <u>Operation Rolling Thunder</u> – bombing NV

Wanted to destroy <u>Ho Chi Minh Trail</u> – path NV and VC sent men/supplies to SV







1965 – air strikes increase, begin using <u>Napalm</u> and <u>Agent Orange</u>

<u>search and destroy</u> missions
-Kill as many as possible

VietCong military tactics: (guerrilla)

Avoid large battles Travel light Fight on our terms Only fight when victory is sure

****EXTREMELY dedicated to their cause**

Jan 1973 – US, NV, SV, VC sign <u>Paris Peace</u> <u>Accords</u>

1. Cease fire

- 2. Withdrawal of US
- 3. POWs exchanged
- 4. Out of Laos and Cambodia
 - 5. Vietnam stay divided

Americans leave – NV & SV fail to honor cease fire or try to work together

April, 1975 Saigon falls to NV – Renamed Ho Chi Minh City
